One day he took heart and told his parents.

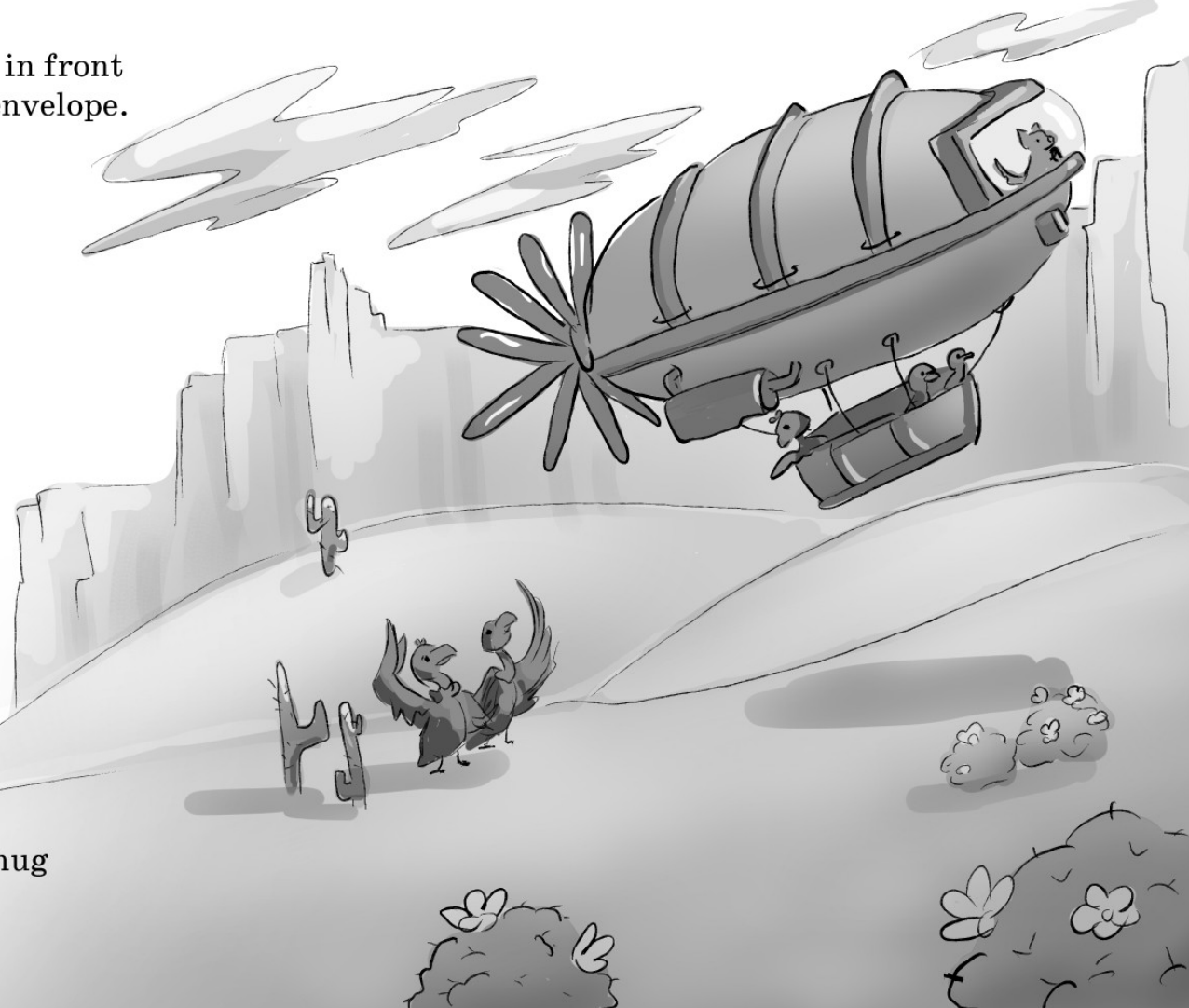
Mum? Dad?

and I flooded the whole nest...

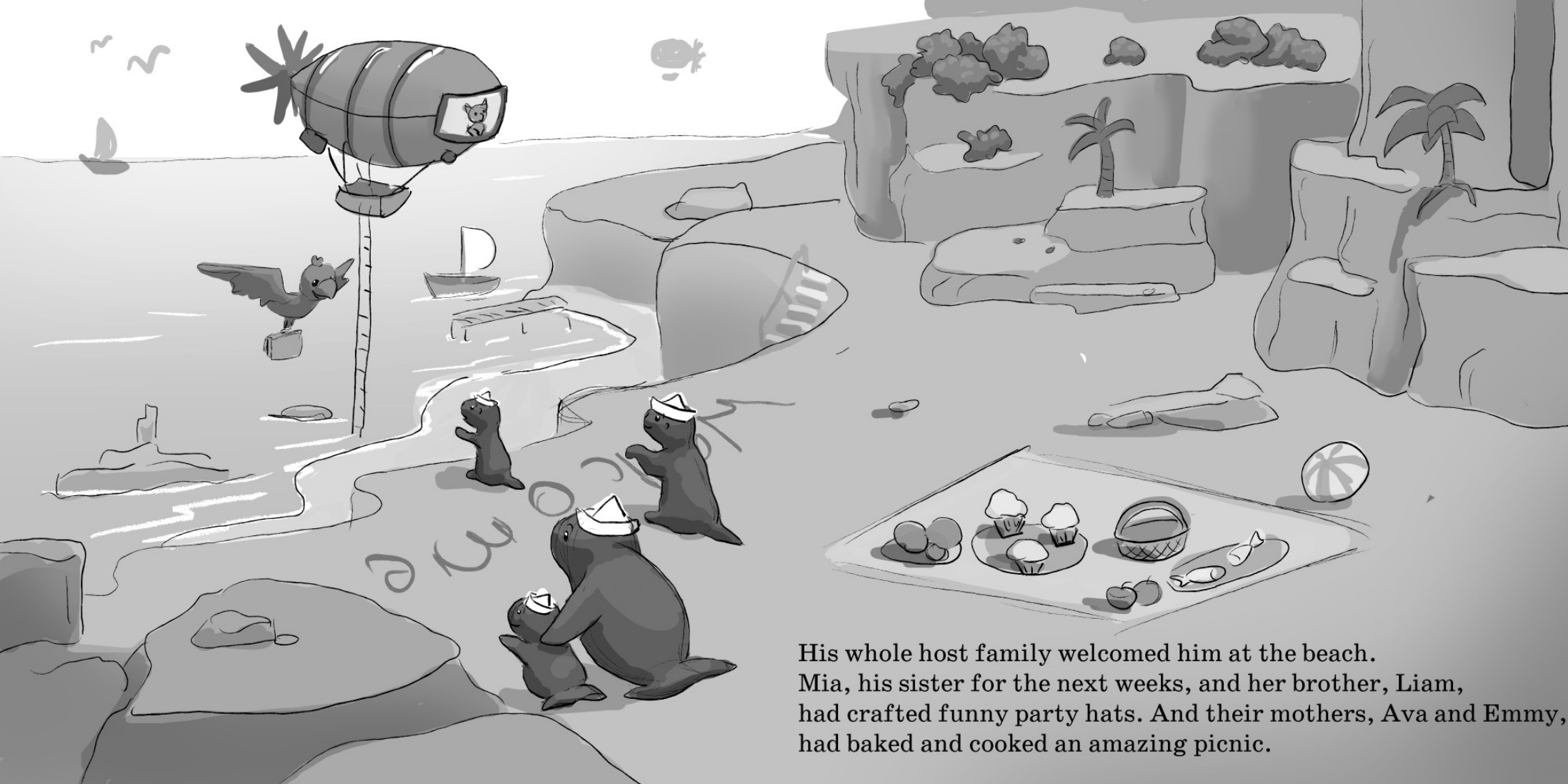
What do you mean?

He dove in the water and...



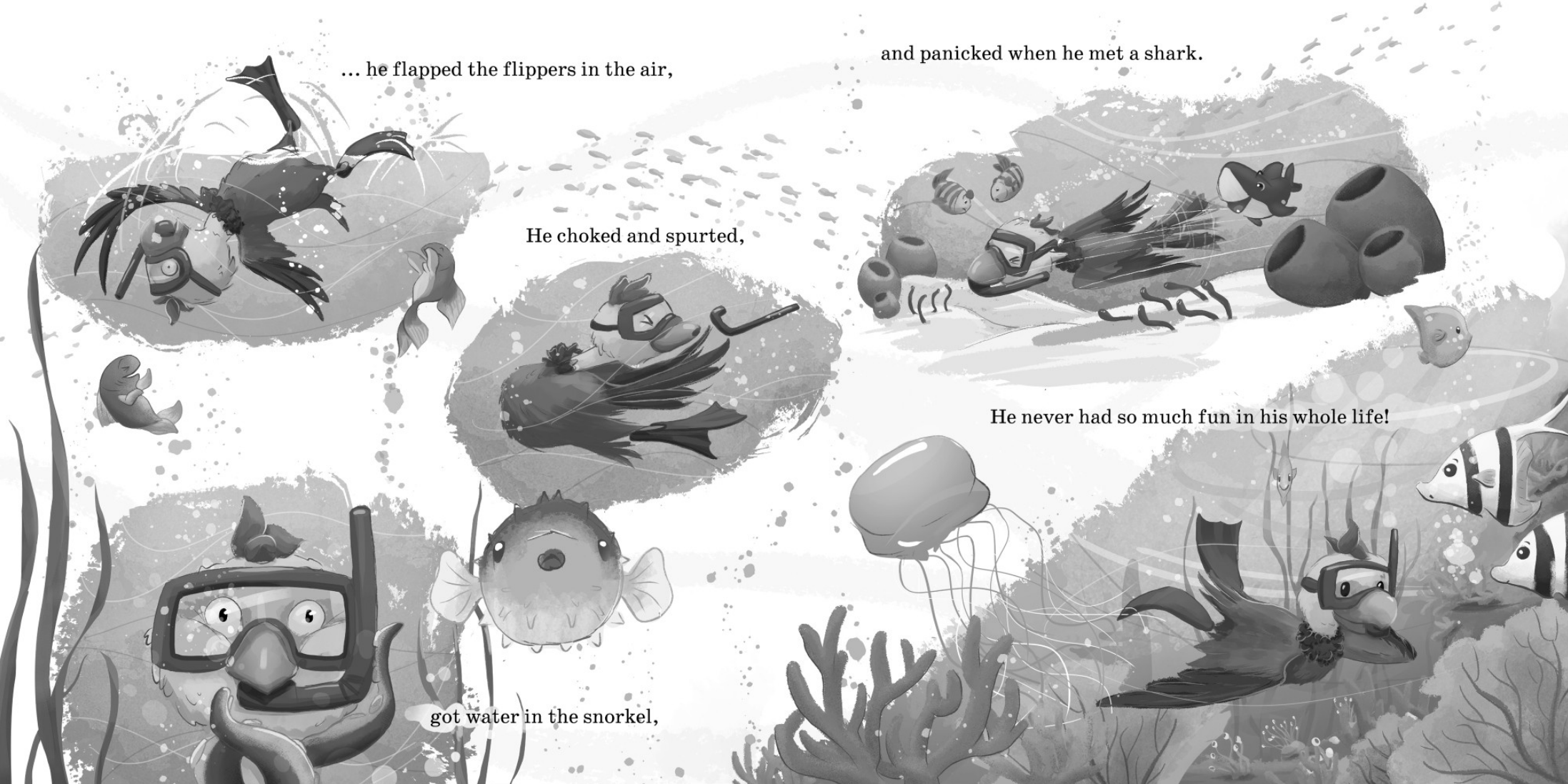
... he flapped the flippers in the air,

and Paavo didn't dare to swim closer.



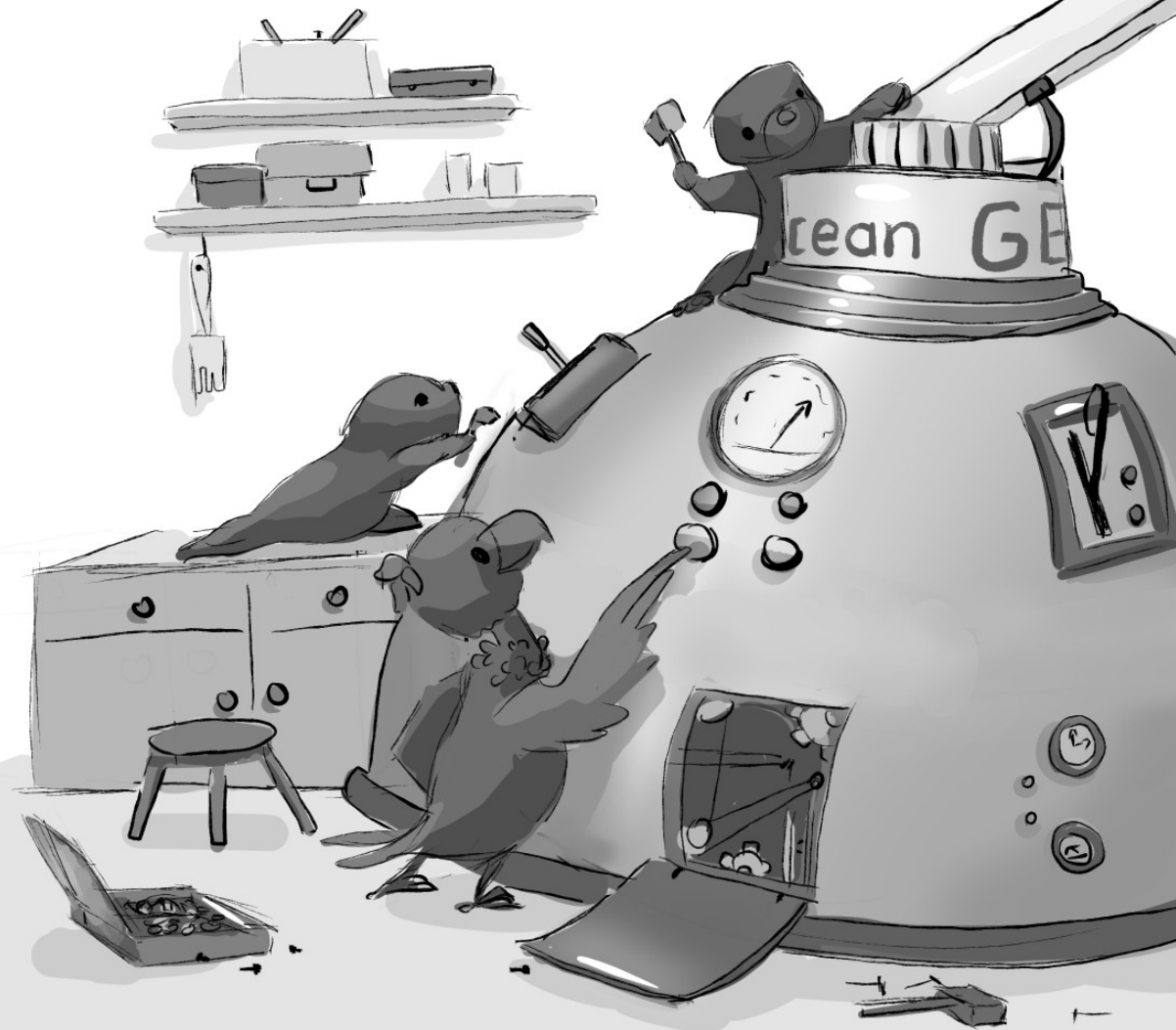
Back at the beach Paavo told the others of his horrible discovery.

We all stay as far away as possible.

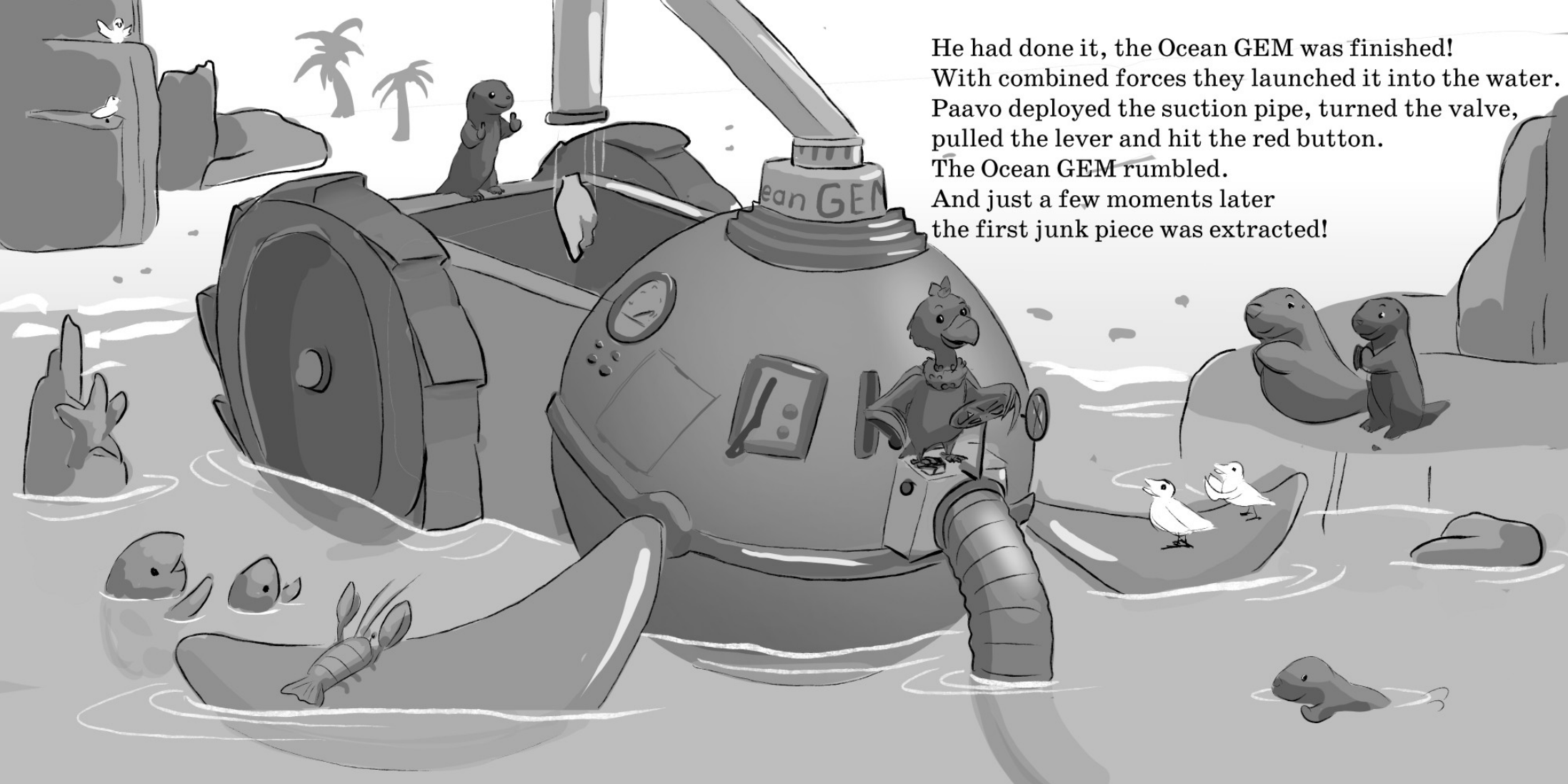




This night Paavo lay awake, pondering.

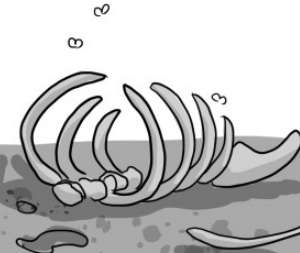
Andean Condor
